According to the United Nations, 4 billion people live life “far from the law’s protection.” For poor people in the developing world, violence is as much a part of everyday life as more familiar issues, like lack of clean water or access to medical care.

International Justice Mission (IJM) is a global leader in protecting the poor from violence, working directly on the frontlines. IJM partners with local law enforcement and other authorities to rescue victims of violence, bring criminals to justice, restore survivors, and strengthen justice systems.

The largest organization of its kind, IJM has ongoing operations in nearly 20 communities throughout South and Southeast Asia, Africa and Latin America. IJM attorneys, investigators, social workers, community activists and other professionals – 95% of whom are at work in their own countries – have rescued thousands of victims of slavery, sex trafficking, police brutality and other criminal violence, and work to protect millions more by strengthening their justice systems.
